#### A. ACADEMICS


### • Strength of Faculty Members and Research Engineers in the Institute:

Institute is happy to inform the Board that efforts made in last one year have attracted good candidates for the positions of Faculty Members and Research Engineers. Excluding Emeritus Professor, the Faculty strength of the Institute has reached 17 with 2 Professors, 4 Associate Professors, 7 Assistant Professors and 4 Visiting Faculty. There is one candidate for the position of Professor and 3 candidates for the positions of Assistant Professor, who were selected by the respective Selection Committee, but have asked for extension of the date for joining the Institute. It is hoped that they would be joining the Institute soon. Similarly, the positions of 4 Research Engineers (Grade I) have been filled. Names, professional details and areas of interest and specialization of (i) the faculty members and (ii) Research Engineers are given as **Annexure I** of this Overview Report.

The list of Guest Faculty Members is also enclosed in the Annexure I.

### Admission of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Undergraduate Batch in the Institute:

The 3<sup>rd</sup> batch of 76 B Tech students took admission in August 2007. The batch comprises 71 boy students and 5 girl students. The state-wise break-up of students has been shown in the following pie-chart.



State wise Distribution of Students Admitted in the B Tech Programme in August 2007

Hostel accommodation for the new batch has been done in Hostel VIII of the Jabalpur Engineering College. This hostel, in its as-received condition required considerable repair and renovation. As per requirement of the Board, the same was undertaken and completed prior to the arrival of students in August 2007. This hostel has been accommodating all boy students of the batch in double seated rooms. Girls students from the batch have been accommodated with II year girl students in the hostel provided by the Tropical Forest Research Institute (TFRI) which is also accommodating all boy students of II year.

### Curriculum and Running of Various Courses:

The B Tech Curriculum of the Institute, worked out by the Curriculum Committee comprising of experts from IIT Kanpur and IIT Bombay and wetted by the Japanese experts (presented in the last meeting of the Board held on May 11, 2007) still requires continuous development and innovation. The Institute is conscious of its role in this regard and the same is being pursued.

The first batch of undergraduate students of the Institute is now in its 3<sup>rd</sup> year, Students of three disciplines, namely (i) Computer Science & Engineering, (ii) Electronics & Communication Engineering (ECE) and (iii) Mechanical Engineering students have to be offered specific courses of their disciplines. Institute thus has to offer a large number of courses.

Though the Institute has recently recruited a reasonably good number of faculty members specializing in different areas of Science and Engineering, running of courses, as per requirements of the approved Curriculum, still poses a few problems. Such problems are more acute for Computer Science & Engineering (CSE), the discipline in which finding good faculty members still remains a big bottleneck. However, the Institute has been fulfilling its obligation by offering the requisite number of courses by judiciously reshuffling them within the Curriculum. This, however, has been done after taking the approval from the Senate.

In the light of the above observations, the Institute needs to continue pursuing the policy of tracking down good candidates for faculty positions from among senior PhD students in different IITs, IISc Bangalore, BHU IT and other prestigious institutes. The Institute is also in touch with some good candidates from abroad.

In the mean time, the Institute is fast reaching the number of faculty positions initially assigned by the Ministry. On the basis of the projected student strength of the Institute till the year 2011-12 (passed by the Board in its Meeting held on January 03, 2007), the Institute has therefore requested the Ministry to sanction an additional number of positions for the Faculty and Research Engineers. It is hoped that with such an approval granted in the near future the efforts being made in attracting bright young faculty members will not be dampened and the Institute will be able to overcome the problems pertaining to offering its various courses.

### • Progress Towards the Indo-Japanese Cooperation:

 On the request from the Japanese side, a short visit to Japan was made by the Director from July 11 – 14, 2007. A meeting on July 12 was held in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in which the following twelve Japanese Consortium Partners for IIIDMJ were finalized:

- A team of 5 faculty members of IIITDMJ shall be visiting Japan in the month of December 2007. The constitution of the team of faculty members was decided by the Committee headed by Prof Aparajita Ojha.
- Four faculty members from the University of Tokyo will be visiting IIITDM
  Jabalpur in the month of January for a period of one week. During this
  period they will be giving lectures in courses related to: "Computer
  Graphics, Simulation & Visualization" and "Control Systems: Theory,
  Software and Hardware".

### Workshop on "E-Governance – Specific Applications on Policing"

Prof Arvind Varma, an alumnus of IIT Kanpur, is a Professor of Criminal Justice in the Indiana University, USA. At his behest the Institute organized a two-day workshop on **e-Governance – Specific in Policing** from August 7-8, 2007. The workshop had a few technical presentations on advanced IT tools which have recently been developed for various policing applications. The Workshop was concluded with a Panel Discussion in which Commissioner, Collector, IG and SP of Jabalpur, very senior police officials from Bhopal, Chindwada and Siwani and a few academicians participated. The Panel Discussion identified several project/ research topics which could be undertaken by the students of the Institute. The Workshop was coordinated by Dr Pritee Khanna, Assistant Professor at the Institute.

It is heartening to note that Prof Arvind Varma has accepted the offer of the Institute to spend some time in Jabalpur during summer and December vacations every year. During such a stay, he would supervise the project work done by IIITDM Jabalpur students in this field. It is envisaged that this cooperation would lead to research collaboration between IIITDM Jabalpur and Indiana University, USA in the area of e-governance and policing.

### Workshop on Data Base Management Systems (DBMS) & Java Application Software Package

Computer Science is an ever changing field and the faculty requires to be updated all the time. With this viewpoint, the Institute organized a two days Workshop on "DBMS and Java Application Software package" on August 6-7, 2007. The training on IBM DB2 and Websphere Studio Application Developer (WSAD) was provided by the experts of IBM India Pvt. Ltd, New Delhi. The Workshop gave the faculty an opportunity to learn a new technology in the filed of software development. Apart from our own faculty, faculty members of various Institutes and colleges of Jabalpur participated in the workshop. The workshop was oragnized free of cost and general hospitality was borne by the Institute. It was coordinated by Dr Pritee Khanna, Assistant Professor at the Institute.

### Workshop on "Designing and Fabrication with Fiber Reinforced Composites":

Giving hands-on training to students is an integral part of the academic philosophy of IIITDM Jabalpur. In pursuance of this philosophy, a two-week workshop on "Designing and Fabrication with Fiber Reinforced Composites" was organized in the Institute between from June 4-16, 2007. Prof Amit Ray of IIT Kanpur and other distinguished persons from outside Jabalpur gave lectures to students regarding product design, aesthetics, materials etc. These lectures were synchronized with hands-on experience on working with glass reinforced polymeric materials for which the Institute had made special arrangements.

Students of 3<sup>rd</sup> year were required to design their own products. The Workshop ended with the exhibition of products designed and fabricated by students.

With the experience gained in conducting this Workshop in summer of 2007, the Institute would like to arrange the every year and would open its doors for attending to outside organizations also.

### Research Proposals and Publications by the Faculty:

As per decision of the Board, the Institute has the provision of providing an Initiation Grant of Rs 10,00,000/- for its faculty members. The Institute has also been vigorously following the practice of motivating its faculty members to write research proposals for funding from outside agencies and publishing research papers on their results in journals of repute. Research proposals for funding and some of the research papers published in journals or accepted for publication in last one year are given in **Annexure II** of this Overview Report.

### B. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

### • <u>Temporary Construction Activities in the IT Bhawan of the Jabalpur</u> Engineering College

With the admissions of the 3<sup>rd</sup> batch of B Tech students in August 2007, the requirement of space for the required number of class rooms and laboratories had increased. Since the space provided to the Institute by the Jabalpur Engineering College in its IT Bhawan was inadequate, the Finance Committee and the Board had given the approval in its meeting held on January 03, 2007 to go for temporary construction of class rooms, laboratory space and faculty offices on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the building.

Accordingly, the construction activities for a Lecture Room with the capacity of 125 seats, a laboratory space where ~ 80 students can work together, another laboratory space where ~ 40 students can work together, offices for ~ 15 faculty members were initiated. Construction for a Mechanical Engineering Workshop on the ground floor was also undertaken. Construction work for the new Lecture Room and the laboratory space for 80 students and 10 faculty offices could be completed before the new batch of students were admitted. Construction work related to other activities will be completed by the end of November 2007.

### Repair and Maintenance Activities in Hostel VIII of the Jabalpur Engineering College

With fresh admissions in August 2007, the additional requirement of the hostel accommodation for both undergraduate as well as postgraduate students of the Institute had been created. Hostel VIII of the Jabalpur Engineering College, which was earlier identified as the temporary Hall of Residence for the students of IIITDMJ, was not in a good condition and, if to be used, had required considerable amount of repair and maintenance work. Since no other venue was available near the Institute on the rental basis for the accommodation of students, the Institute had sought the permission to undertake the repair and maintenance work for Hostel VIII of the JEC from the Finance Committee and the Board in the meeting held on January 03, 2007. The Board is informed that the same was undertaken and completed before the new admissions were made in August 2007.

### Construction Activities in the Institute Campus at Dumna

Construction of three buildings, namely (i) Hall of Residence I, (ii) Core Labs Complex (CLC) and (iii) Service Block, is under progress. Due to some internal factors, the pace of construction is somewhat slow. However, efforts are being made to see that the Institute starts functioning from its own campus from August 2008.

As per requirement of the Board, the exercise of having a panel of architects, rather than a single architect, has been completed (included as a separate agenda item). It is hoped that campus based construction activities will now move more efficiently. In order to expedite matters pertaining to architectural design requirements, the Institute has also appointed (a) Padmashree Dr JR Bhalla, Architect & Former President International Union of Architects, Commonwealth Association of Architects & Council of Architecture of India New Delhi as a Senior Consultant and (b) Mr HK yadav, Architect and Senior Consultant, Indira Gandhi National Center for the Arts, New Delhi

### C. STUDENTS WELFARE AND RELATED ACTIVITIES

### • Distribution of Notional Prizes and Certificates of Merit:

In order to give recognition to meritorious students for their excellent academic performance from each undergraduate batch, the Senate of the Institute recommends that

"Notional Prizes and Certificates of Merit shall be awarded to 7 percent of the students of each undergraduate batch for excellent academic performance in an academic year. In the first two years, the 7 percent shall be calculated for the entire B Tech batch, whereas for the third year the award shall be made for each discipline taking into account their respective strengths."

The Institute decided to start a function for the distribution of Notional Prizes and Certificates of Merit from this year on the occasion of Teachers' Day, i.e. on September 05 every year. The function was accordingly organized on September 05, 2007.

### • Holding of English Proficiency Development Classes:

Though the Institute's curriculum has a compulsory course on communication skills in English, the results collated by the Academic Performance Evaluation Committee of the Senate suggest that the course by itself does not provide sufficient opportunities for developing communication skills in English. Such findings are specially true for those students who come from weaker economic background.

On the recommendation of the Senate, the Institute from this year has started special English Proficiency Development course for such students. The course is run outside the purview of the regular curriculum and is offered to students on a voluntary basis. The Convener of the Undergraduate Committee of Senate (UGCS) recommends the names of students who are advised to attend classes for the course. Students who are advised but wish to abstain from the course are required to give a declaration that in case of inadequate academic performance they will not complain lack of comprehension in classes due to English being the medium of instructions at the Institute.

### Setting-Up of Students Gymkhana of IIITDM Jabalpur

In order to ensure that students of IIITDMJ develop a very well rounded personality, it is essential that they are trained to manage themselves in a professional and democratic manner. For developing in them the sense of ownership for the Institute, they should also be involved in decision making process at the Institute level. IIITDMJ therefore gives them representation in various committees of the Institute. Students of IIITDMJ, therefore, need their own organization.

With the view that the organizational structure gives them the opportunity to (i) manage their own affairs in a democratic manner, (ii) create different hobby clubs on the membership basis and (iii) nominate student representatives in (a) different standing Committees of the Senate and (b) other administrative bodies of the Institute, a set of General Body Meetings with students as well as faculty members were held. The following decisions were taken in the meetings:

- Structure of Students Gymkhana will comprise of an executive wing comprising of (1) President, (2) General Secretary, Games & Sports, (3) General Secretary, Cultural and (4) General Secretart, Science & Technology. For each executive wing of Students Gymkhana there shall be a Faculty Counselor who will be appointed by the Director from the panel of names received from students
- 2. Students Gymkhana will also comprise of a **Students Senate** for which about 25 Senators shall be elected as representatives of the General Body of students. Instead of senators representing students of different batches, they shall be elected on the basis of they representing different **Halls of Residence**.
- 3. A Committee of students must be constituted which will be working out the details of the Constitution of Students Gymkhana. The Committee is expected to give its report in January 2008. Recommendations of the Committee, after suitable modifications are incorporated by discussing with the Institute administration, shall be placed for discussion in the Senate of the Institute. The Constitution of Students Gymkhana will be implemented after is cleared by the Senate of the Institute.
- 4. In the mean time, elections for the four executive posts shall be held.

In view of above decisions from the General Body, the Committee of students for working out the details of the Constitution has been made. At the same time, elections for the four executive posts were also held. Elected representatives are as follows:

### Arrangement for Music Classes for Students

Appreciation of musical arts, paintings and literature is a part of development of sense of aesthetics and creativity among students, especially those of IIITDM Jabalpur which has a strong inclination towards "design". Development of such sensitivity towards arts also helps in creating a strong sense of harmony in engineering students which indirectly helps in developing an all-round personality in them. While the appreciation of musical arts is not an integral part of IIITDM Jabalpur curriculum, such capabilities can be enhanced by creating opportunities outside the purview of the regular curriculum.

The Institute has made arrangements for special coaching in lessons of music, classes for which are held on Sundays. A large number of students have opted for the same and students are divided into three sections. Students are made to learn and practice chords, harmony and beat on musical instruments.

### BoG/2007-08: 02.06 Proposal for Appointment of Prof Amit Ray as an Emeritus Fellow at IIITDM Jabalpur

Prof Amit Ray retired from IIT Kanpur in June 2006 and is currently an Emeritus Fellow at the same Institute. His term as an Emeritus Fellow is also coming to an end in June 2008. Prof Amit Ray is known internationally and nationally an expert in Design, Arts and Aesthetics. The Curriculum Vitae of Prof Ray is given on **Annexure III** he has been helping the Institute as Guest Faculty since the time of its inception. It is proposed that Prof Amit Ray be employed as an Emeritus Fellow at PDPM IIITDM Jabalpur for a period of five years with effect from June 2008. His compensation during the period of this fellowship shall be as per norms of the Central Government. It is proposed that the Institute, in addition, takes care of his accommodation and local transport and pays him TA/DA for attending national/International Seminars/Conferences/ Symposia/ Workshops/ Meetings, as per rules of Government of India, upon his invitation by the concerned institution(s). The same shall be admissible to him on the approval by the competent authority of the Institute.

### BoG/2007-08: 02.07 Appointment of Adjunct Faculty at IIITDM Jabalpur

Though the Institute has been able to attract well qualified faculty members in several disciplines and areas of specialization, it will still take some time before it feels comfortable in this regard. Further, most of these faculty members, though coming from good schools, are fresh doctorates and, therefore, still raw. They require mentoring and grooming by more experienced and seasoned faculty members. Both these problems, i.e. (a) filling the gaps in the areas where the Institute does not possess a well qualified faculty and (b) mentoring and grooming of young faculty, can be addressed by having a strong association with seasoned faculty members, current or retired, from (i) IITs, IISc Bangalore and other institutes of good repute, (ii) outside universities and institutes and (iii) industries of repute, Names of such persons would be cleared by a sub-committee of the Senate. The Institute would like to consider such faculty members as Adjunct Faculty of IIITDM Jabalpur. The Finance Committee is request to recommend the same for the approval by the Board with the following conditions:

- . The Institute would pay for the to-and-fro air fare within India for each visit,
- The Institute will take care of the local hospitality and transport during the stay in the Institute,
- An honorarium of Rs 3000/- per lecture will be given
