FC/2010: 03.02 Overview Report by the Director

The Institute has entered in its 5th Financial Year. Its main emphasis in these initial years has been on providing infrastructure to facilitate faculty and students by providing them all possible amenities. For construction of various buildings the Institute has assigned the major works of Lecture Hall and Tutorial Complex, Hall of Residence-4 (third coming up hostel), Hall of Residence-7(post graduate hostel), Mess & Dining Hall, Security Barrack, Visitors Hostel (Guest House) and Narmada Residency-II and III (Employee Quarters) to CPWD. The Institute has also planned to hand over the construction work of Central Library-Cum-Computer Centre, Student activity Centre and P.G. Hostel to CPWD.

The Institute was allocated Rs. 3000 lakhs as Plan grant for the F.Y. 2010-11. Till October 30, 2010 Rs. 2733 lakhs have been received and Rs. 2498 lakhs have already been spent. The major expenditure was done in (1) Civil Works Rs.1667.58 lakhs which includes major payments of Rs. 720 lakhs, Hall of Residence -3 (Triple Seater) Rs. 727.64 lakhs and Hall of Residedence-1 Rs. 86.56 lakhs to CPWD, (2) Electrical works Rs. 118.80 lakhs for Electrical Supply & Management(Rs. 66.87 lakhs) 33 KVA HT Line (Rs. 30.89 lakhs) and Rs. 21.04 for other Electrical works (3) Lab and Office Equipments Rs. 92.81 lakhs (4) Computer Hardware and Software Rs. 29.50 lakhs. (5) Furniture Rs. 48.37 lakhs (6) Salary & Wages Rs. 288 lakhs. (7) Non salary components (recurring) Rs. 252.00 lakhs.

To meet the growing expenditure of salary and wages and other recurring expenditure and to create capital assets, the Institute is submitting a revised budget of Rs. 6000 lakhs for the consideration of the Finance Committee.

The annual audit of the Institute for the financial year 2009-10 is already completed and audit report has been received by the institute. No major observation is made by the Audit.

The Final Audit Report for the F.Y. 2009-10 received from Auditor General Madhya Pradesh Gwalior is placed as <u>FC/2010/3/Annexure-IV</u> for consideration and recommendation to the BOG for adoption.

FC/2010: 03.07 To consider proposal for Accidental Policy for the employees of the Institute.

To have social security to the families of serving employees at the time of any eventuality of untimely accidental death or permanent total disablement, a proposal is placed as FC/2010/3/Annexure-V with justification. The Finance Committee is requested to consider the proposal of the Institute and to recommend the same to the BOG for consideration and approval.

FC/2010: 03.08 Proposal for Utilization of Professional Development Fund.

MHRD, GOI vide its letter No. F. No. 23-1/2008-TS.II dated 18 August 2009, para 8(iii) placed as <u>FC/2010/3/Annexure-VI</u> has allowed Professional Development Fund of Rs. 3.00 lakhs for every block period of 3 years (Rs. One lakh every year) to meet the expenses for attending national and international conferences, paying the membership fee of various professional bodies, purchase of books and contingent expenses on reimbursable basis. It is proposed to use the fund as per following guidelines:-

- (a) Reimbursement of cost of Books upto Rs. 15,000/- in a financial year.
- (b) Reimbursement of membership fee of at most one professional body.

- (c) Reimbursement of stationery upto Rs. 1,000/- in a financial year.
- (d) A faculty will be permitted to use a maximum of Rs. 3.00 lakhs in a slot of three years span with the ceiling that in a financial year not more than Rs. 1.30 lakhs is utilized. The Amount overspent in an year will be deducted from the amount allocated in the next financial year and amount not utilized in an year will be added to the PDF in the next year in the block. The unspent balance in the last year of the block will not be carried forward to the next block of years.
- (e) For attending international conferences, DA will be reimbursed as per Govt of India rules as applicable from time to time to meet the expenses on food and local travel.

FC/2010: 03.09 Proposal for consideration of giving interest to NPS Employees from the F.Y. 2005-06 onwards.

The Institute was established in the F.Y. 2005-06. NPS contribution of Employees and Employer part was deducted and deposited in a separate account of NPS in State Bank of India at JEC Branch Jabalpur. During these years earning from interest was very less. The F.C. is requested to consider giving of 8% interest per annum from the F.Y. 2005-06 onwards to avoid loss to the employees. The fund could not manage for earning of enough interest as the Institute was trying to switch over to NPS system which finally came into existence in this year. The total interest payable to the employees would be approximately Rs. 7.50 lakhs. The NPS fund could earn only about Rs. 2.38 lakhs as interest. Therefore, remaining interest to be calculated @ 8% p.a. may be considered and recommended to Board for approval. The calculation sheet is placed as FC/2010/3/Annexure-VII. The Institute has also earned internal income of Rs. 150.00 lakhs (appx) every year (approximate average amount) through various sources such as fee from students, application fees, sale of tenders, income from Visitor's Hostel, interest earned from deposits etc.

FC/2010: 03.10 Proposal for adoption of Scheme of Advances of Central Govt for the Employees of the Institute.

Adoption of various advances (both interest bearing and non-interest bearing) for the welfare of Institute's regular employees as applicable to the Central Govt employees with same terms and conditions is proposed. The list containing terms and conditions is enclosed as FC/2010/3/Annexure-VIII

FC/2010: 03.11 Proposal for considering Special Allowance to Deputy Directors/ Deans/Wardens etc. as applicable to IITs. As per para 1.(A) of MHRD, GOI letter No. F. 1-1/2010-TS.I dated 23rd September, 2010 (FC/2010/3/Annexure-IX) Special allowances have been granted to Deputy Directors/Deans/Wardens etc of IITs. The scheme may be adopted by PDPM- IIIT Jabalpur also.

The Chairman asked the Director to begin with the progress report of the institute.

FC/2010:02.02 Overview Report by the Director

The Director of the institute Prof Aparajita Ojha briefed the Committee members about the physical and financial progress of the institute. During discussion, one of the members raised the issue of the frequency of the Finance Committee meetings and suggested to meet at least once in a quarter. The members agreed with the suggestion.

FC/2010:02.03

Confirmation of the Minutes of 2010/1st Meeting of the Finance Committee held on Feb 25, 2010.

Minutes of the 2010/1st meeting of Finance Committee held on February 25, 2010 were confirmed.

FC/2010:02.04

Recommendations of Building & Works Committee held on July 24, 2010

The Finance Committee deliberated on the following recommendations of Building and Works Committee and decided on each of item as mentioned below:-

(1) B&WC/2010:2.03 To consider Preliminary Estimate for the work of Construction of Triple Seated Hall of Residence-2 (Renamed as Hall of Residence-4 during the meeting itself).

The recommendations of the B&WC for the work of construction of Triple Seated Hall of Residence which is renamed as Hall of Residence-4 with a Preliminary Estimate of Rs. 22,78,04,000 /- (Rs. Twenty two crores seventy eight lakhs and four thousand only) including 3% contingencies and 2.5 % Architect Fee (repetitive work) with Service Tax on Fee as applicable were further recommended to the Board of Governors for Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction.

(2) B&WC/2010:02.04 To consider the Preliminary Estimate for the work of Construction of Visitors' Hostel

The recommendations of the B&WC for the work of construction of Visitor Hostel with Preliminary Estimate of Rs. 11,85,22,000/- (Rs. eleven crores eighty five lakhs and twenty two thousand only) including 3% contingencies and 5 % Architect Fee with Service Tax on Fee as applicable were further recommended to the Board of Governors for Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction.

(3) B&WC/2010:02.05 To consider the Revised Preliminary Estimate for the work of Construction of Lecture Hall & Tutorial Complex.

The members deliberated on the recommendations made by the B&WC on requirement of revised preliminary estimate for the Construction work of Lecture Hall & Tutorial Complex (LHTC). The modified drawings of the above building alongwith revised preliminary estimate were also discussed at length by the Committee. The recommendations of B&WC for the above work with a Revised Preliminary Estimate of Rs. 37,31,94,000/- (Rs. Thirty seven crores thirty one lakhs and ninety four thousands only) including 3% contingencies and 5 % Architect Fee with Service Tax on Fee as applicable were further recommended to the Board of Governors for Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction.

(4) B&WC/2010:02.06 To consider the Revised Estimate (RE) for the work of Shifting of 33 KV Dumna Feeder away from the PDPM-IIITDM Campus.

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The approval of Revised Estimates (RE) of Rs. 18,00,104 (Rs. Eighteen lakhs and one hundred four only) given by the B&WC was noted by the Committee.

(5) B&WC/2010:02.07 To consider the Revised Estimate(RE) for the work of Power Supply to 1500 KVA new HT connection on 33 KV to PDPM-IIITDM.

The recommendations by the B&WC on the revised estimate submitted by Madhya Pradesh Poorva Kshetra Vidyut Vitran Company Ltd (MPKVV) for the above work were considered by the Committee. The Finance Committee further recommended the Revised Estimate amounting to Rs. 1,33,28,340/- (Rs. One Crore, thirty three lakhs twenty eight thousands three hundred forty only) against previous approval of Rs. 1,31,14,268/- (Rs. One crore thirty one lakhs fourteen thousand two hundred sixty eight only) for Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction (A/A & E/S) of the Board of Governors.

(6) B&WC/2010:02.08 To consider the Preliminary cum Detailed Estimate for the work of Construction of Road Network (Phase-I) at PDPM-IIITDM.

After discussion the Committee recommended the work of laying and construction of Road Network (Ph-I) for an estimate as provided by the CPWD for the above work amounting to Rs.2,55,00,000/- (Rs. two crores fifty five lakhs) (including Architect Fee) for Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction to the Board of Governors.

(7) B&WC/2010:02.09 To consider the Preliminary Estimate for the work of External Electrification & Lighting (Phase-I)

Agenda was postponed by B&WC. No action was taken by Finance Committee.

(8) B&WC/2010:02.10 Report item

The Committee noted the A/A & E/S of various works given by the Director for small / minor works carried out by Institute.

The present status of the above work was informed to the Committee. It was also informed to the Committee that though provisional extension of time was granted to the agency upto 31st May 2010 (as approved by the BOG in its 2010/1st meeting), but finishing items in the last block of the building still require some time and the agency has made a request to further grant

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extension of time upto 31st August 2010. Considering the present pace of work and the recommendations of the B&WC the Finance Committee recommended granting provisional extension of time to the agency upto 31st August 2010 for Civil works to the Board of Governors. The Committee also recommended extending time to the concerned Electrical Agency accordingly, as per the recommendations of the B&WC.

(b) B&WC/2010/02:11.2 To consider the matter related to release of Security Deposit against Bank Guarantee/FDR.

The Finance Committee noted the decision of the B&WC for asking the opinion of Chief of CPWD on the matter.

(c) B&WC/2010/02:11.3 Report item – Award of the Work of Exection of HT Line (2nd Circuit) from Sita Pahad to Gora Bazar. (Providing of 1500 KVA load on 33KV to PDPM IIITDM Jabalpur) on (L1) negotiated amount of Rs. 62 lakhs.








- PG Hostel brief: Married Student Housing for 100 1 BR apartments & 400 single seater Hostel.
- I BR apartment of Married Student Housing consists of Living, Dining, kitchen, Bedroom & Toilet.
- Facilities Block to cater to Administration, Warden, Recreation, Canteen, Lounge etc.

This revised Preliminary Estimate has been trained by M.s. Kanvinde Rick Chowdhary of Vichitectural and Structural Consultants for the probable cost of Rs. 1473 Eacs (Rupees One thousand four hundred and seventy three Lacs only Tincluding contingencies).

REPORT

HISTORY :- This revised preliminary estimate amounting to Rs. 1473 lacs including 5 lacs contingencies has been framed for revised administrative approval and expenditure sanction in the competent authority for the above mentioned work.

the idministrative approval and expenditure sanction for the work amounting Rs. 197 facs had been accorded by the Board of Governors PDPM-HIDM Jabalpur during its meeting dtd. August-04 2006 Because of cost enhancement during the Construction period with a stipulated date of completion as ten months the revised preliminary estimate has been prepared considering the approved cost index of 260 as on 01 10.07 over the DPAR 92 as 100.

DESIGN & SCOPF: - The design of the proposed building has the following features:

- 1) Hostel is designed for 408 student capacity.
- One complete Hostel comprises six cruster of residential rooms and common facilities like Administrative office, recreation room, canteen sitenen, meeting room, library, lounge TV room.
- The residential blocks are four storied and Administrative block and common rooms are two storied RCC framed structure.
- All rooms are single seated and have a carpet area of about 10.5 sqm including the cur board.
- Each wing of the residential cluster has a covered cycle parking area of about 70 sqm. Close to the staircase
- 6) A utility verandah for the activities like drying clothes has been provided at all floors of each wing of residential cluster.

BASIC APPROACH FOR PREPARATION OF DELHI SCHEDULE OF RATES, 2007

- DSR 2007 has been prepared on the basis of coefficients of labour, materials, sundries, hire charges etc. adopted in DAR 1997 and market rates of materials at Delhi collected during the period of April 2007 to October 2007. Labour rates are current minimum wage rates issued by the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi w.e.f. 01-09-2007.
- DARs 1997 are under revision. Till the issue of revised DARs, existing DARs 1997 may be followed after correlating with relevant items.
- Sundries have been consic ared as 2.60 times based on Cost Index of Delhi as 260 as on 1.10.2007 over DPAR 01-01-1992 as 100.
- Contractor's profit and Overheads @ 15% has been adopted as approved by the DGW vide Office Memorandum no. DG (W) MAN/150 dated 14/12/2007.
- This schedule will be read along with CPWD specifications, 1996 Vol-1 to VI with up-to-date correction slips, 1 to 19 and revised CPWD Specifications 2002 for Mortar, Cement concrete and RCC till these are amended/ modified.

BOG/2006.2.14 | Confirmation of Minutes of the 2006/1st meeting of B&WC held on July 14, 2006

- 1. The Institute architect presented the campus master plan depicting proposed broad zoning of (i) academic area, (ii) hostel areas and (iii) residential area for the faculty and staff. The master plan was discussed in details. However, in view of the land topography, land distribution and various functional requirements of the campus, the master plan proposed by the architect was accepted by the Board.
- 2. As desired by the Finance Committee in the meeting held on July 25, 2006, the comparative statements for the proposed estimated costs for hostels, lecture halls and class rooms complex (LHCRC) and course labs of the Institute vis-à-vis-those of IIT Kanpur were placed before the Board. It was observed that the constructed floor area per student in hostels of PDPM-IIITDM Jabalpur (27.15 sqm) was marginally higher than that of Hall-IX of IIT Kanpur which was being currently built. However, the constructed (25.85 sqm) area per student was similar to that of other hostels of IIT Kanpur. Since the land available to PDPM-IIITDM Jabalpur is undulated and thus required different approach for designing its building, the Board accepted the figures presented by the Institute.

The estimated cost of construction per sqm, of the Lecture Hall Complex including energy efficient measures and air conditioning, was observed to be lower at PDPM-IIITDM Jabapur (Rs. 14,942/-) in comparison to the same at IIT Kanpur (Rs. 16,800/-), on the other hand, the cost per sqm of hostels without energy efficiency measures at PDPM-IIITDM Jabalpur (Rs. 9,692/-) were marginally higher than those at IIT Kanpur (Rs. 9,046/-). This marginal increase was attributed to frame-structure construction approach to be followed at Jabalpur (due to inferior quality of bricks) vis-à-vis load bearing structure approach followed at IIT Kanpur (Annex - 10)

In view of the above the Board found (a) proposed the constructed area per student and (b) estimated cost of construction per sqm reasonable and comparable with that at IIT Kanpur. The Board further accepted the incorporation of energy efficiency features and associated superior specifications proposed for the two hostels.

In view of the above, the Board gave the administrative and financial approval for the construction of two 408 capacity of each Hostels, Lecture Halls and Class Rooms Complex (LHRC) and the course labs at preliminary estimates of Rs. 2384 lacs, Rs. 661 lacs and Rs. 700 lacs respectively.

3. In view of the urgency of the situation, the Chairman desired that the Institute works for building temporary and flexible structures in the campus with the aim of holding classes and labs of the Institute there from the next academic session itself. The Institute architect was requested to do the needful in this regard.

The proposal for organizing the following four Distinguished Lecture Series in the Institute on an annual basis was presented to the Board:

- 1. Vishwesharayya Distinguished Lecture in the area of Engineering Technology
- 2. Ramanujan Distinguished Lecture in the area of Computer Science & Engineering
- 3. Raman Distinguished Lecture in the area of Biological and Physical Sciences with computational applications
- 4. Tagore Distinguished Lecture in the area of Arts, Social Sciences and Humanities.

The Board was informed that these lectures (preferably two in each semester) shall be delivered by very eminent academics who shall be selected by the committee appointed by the Director. The Institute shall make them available in the printed form as part of an annual publication with CDs for their multi-media coverage. Efforts shall also be made to telecast them.

The Board appreciated the proposal and approved the initiation of the four distinguished lecture series. It also approved an honorarium of Rs 25,000/- per lecture besides TA/DA and local hospitality to the speakers.

BOG/2006.2.17(B) 2 Proposal for Setting up a National Center for Computational Engineering & Science

The Director informed the Board that he had constituted an Expert Committee, with Prof Dikshit as the Convener, for advising the Institute regarding the proposal to set up a National Center focused on Computational Science and Engineering at PDPM IIITDM Jabalpur. Subsequently, a meeting of the Expert Committee was held in the office of the Secretary Education, Minister of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India on July 26, 2006 in which Prof Dikshit had made a presentation about the concept and possible directions of development of teaching and research programmes under the Center (Minutes enclosed).

The proposal to set up the National Center for Computational Engineering & Science at the Institute was discussed in details. The Board felt that the proposal was indeed commendable and would fit into the theme of the Institute, i.e. IT, Design and Manufacturing at both undergraduate as well as postgraduate levels. The Board resolved the following in this regard:

 Efforts must be made to develop and introduce Research/M.Tech./B.Tech./ Dual Degree programmes in the area of computational engineering & science from the academic session 2007-08. An expert group could be consulted for deciding about nomenclature of such programmes.

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- 2 The process of developing and enhancing new capabilities at the Institute in emerging directions must be achieved by organizing seminars and workshops in the first year.
- 3. The Institute must make a proposal for funding from an appropriate agency to set up the National Center including the Vision Statement, the need for the programme, the expertise already available at the Institute, the infrastructural support needed at the center and the budgetary provisions that must be made to create and maintain such a center over a long term.

Doctoral/Post-Doctoral level academics and professionals may be appointed as Consultants/Senior Research Associates/Fellows in the Center as per sanctioned provisions.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Pandit Dwarka Prasad Mishra, Indian Institute of Information Technology. Design and Manufacturing (PDPM-IIIT, DM). Jabalpur as at 31 March 2010 and the Income & Expenditure Account/Receipt & Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20 (1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The Audit has been entrusted for the period up to 2013-14. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law. Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects etc. if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/ CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our hudit, we report that:
- (i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit,
- (ii) The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account/Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Ministry of Finance.
- (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Institute in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- (iv) We further report that: -

1. Liabilities

1.1 Liabilities for retirement benefits

A provision for retirement benefits is required to be made every year on the basis of its valuation by an actuary, which has not been done.

B. Grant in aid

During the year 2009-10, Institute has received grant-in-aid (Plan) of Rs.41.00 crore from Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, New Delhi and had unspent balance of Rs.7.58 crore. Out of total available funds of Rs.48.58 crore, the Institute could utilize a sum of Rs.47.45 crore leaving unspent balance of Rs.1.13 crore.

C. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the PDPM, IIIT, DM, Jabalpur through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- (v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account/Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- (vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.

PROPOSAL FOR ACCIDENTAL POLICY

Dated: 11 November 2010

PDPM-IIITDM Jabalpur has been established in Feb 2005 under MHRD, GOI. The Institute was established after the GPF Scheme was discontinued and a new Described Pension Scheme (NPS) was started on contribution basis from both Govt and Employees.

In the old institutions where GPF Pension Scheme is in vogue, following social security measures exist after the death of GPF employees.

- (1) Extra Ordinary Pension Scheme
- (2) Family Pension
- (3) Invalid Pension
- (4) Death Gratuity

- (5) Residuary Gratuity
- (6) Service Gratuity etc.
- (7) Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme

As per NPS norms a person is eligible for pension from the contributed amount after attaining the age of 60 years. No other benefits are available particularly when an employee dies in accident or become permanent incapacitated while in service.

To have social security for the next of kin of deceased employees who dies in accident, or becomes permanent incapacitated, it is proposed to have an accidental death policy for the employees of the Institute as per following benefits:-

Faculty & Officers
 Group B, C and D Employees
 Rs. 10.00 lakhs
 8.00 lakhs

The above mentioned policy is in vogue in some of Central Govt autonomous bodies of MHRD, GOI. It is also learnt that similar policy is being undertaken by other IIITs also.

The source and funding of scheme may be either (i) direct payment by Government body or (ii) it may be given to insurance companies on economical payment basis.

This institute had invited quotations from Govt undertaking Insurance Companies which is Rs. 657/- and 525/- per annum per employee for Group 'A' and other employees respectively.

Subject: -Revision of pay of teaching and other Staff in Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTIs) following the pay revision of the Central Government employees on the recommendation of 6th Central Pay Commission (6th CPC).

Sir.

I am directed to say that the Government of India have decided, after taking into consideration the recommendations made by the Govardhan Mehta Committee, to revise the Pay of teaching and other staff of Centrally Funded Technical Institutions following the pay revision of the Central Government employees on the recommendation of 6th CPC. The revised pay and other service conditions as approved by the Government of India for the teaching and other staff in CFTIs are as under:

1. For Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs), Indian Institute of Science (IISc.) Bangalore, Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs), National Institute of Industrial Engineering (NITIE), Mumbai and Indian Institutes of Science Education & Research (IISERs).

(i) Lecturers

- Lecturers are not part of the regular faculty cadre in these Institutes. Appointment at
 this level may be made as Lecturer-cum-Post Doctoral Fellow on contract basis to
 enable bright young Ph.Ds to teach and earn experience in premier institutions.
- (2) At the entry level they may be placed in Pay Band PB-3 of Rs.15600-39100 with Academic Grade Pay (AGP) of Rs.6000/-p.m. with seven non-compounded advance increments.
- (3) To encourage fresh PhDs to join the teaching system, at least 10% of the total faculty strength should be recruited at this level of Lecturer-cum-Post Doctoral Fellow. However, relaxation in respect of educational qualifications could be given up to 25% of total Lecturers recruited. The reasons for such relaxations should be duly recorded and reported to the Board of Governors of the respective institutions.
- (4) After one year of post Ph.D experience, these Lecturers-cum-Post Doctoral Fellows shall be placed in the AGP of Rs.7000/-p.m.

P. Dihehel

(ii) Assistant Professors

- (1) To be appointed in PB-3 with AGP of Rs. 8000/-p.m. For direct recruits, minimum pay in the Pay Band to be fixed at Rs.30000/-.
- (2) For appointment as Assistant Professor, one should have a Ph.D with first class or equivalent in the appropriate branch with a very good academic record throughout and at least three years' industrial/research/teaching experience, excluding however, the experience gained while pursuing Ph.D.

(iii) Associate Professors

- (1) To be appointed in PB-4 (Rs.37400-67000) with AGP of Rs.9500/-p.m. For direct recruits, minimum pay in the PB-4 to be fixed at Rs. 42800/-.
- (2) For appointment as Associate Professor, one should have a Ph.D with first class or equivalent in the appropriate branch with a very good academic record throughout and a minimum of six years Teaching/ Industry/ Research experience, of which at least three years' should be at the level of Assistant Professors, Senior Scientific Officer/ Senior Design Engineer.

(iv) Professors

- (1) To be appointed in PB-4 (Rs.37400-67000) with AGP of Rs.10500/- p.m. For direct recruits, minimum pay in the Pay Band to be fixed at Rs. 48000/-.
- (2) For appointment as Professor, one should have a Ph.D with first class or equivalent with a very good academic record and a minimum of 10 years' experience.
- (3) Up to a maximum of 40% of the posts of Professors at any given point of time will be eligible for AGP of Rs. 12000/- p.m. after 6 years' of regular service in AGP of Rs. 10500/- p.m. subject to performance evaluation based on research publications, Ph.D supervision, teaching and consultancy services etc.

For other Centrally Funded Technical Institutions.

The pay structure and designations for all other Centrally Funded Technical Institutions will generally be the same as per the scheme of revision of pay of teachers, etc in Universities, etc. as notified by the Ministry of HRD vide letter No.1-32/2006-U.II/U.I (i) dated 31st December, 2008 and clarification issued thereon from time to time. However, in the case of National Institutes of Technology (NITs), Indian School of Mines University (ISMU), Indian Institutes of Information Technology (IIITs) and Schools of Planning & Architecture (SPAs), the following accelerated promotional benefits will be given while maintaining the UGC Pay Structure and designations;

(a) Seven non-compounded advance increments shall be admissible at the entry level of recruitment as Assistant Professor to persons possessing the degree of Ph.D awarded in the relevant discipline.

Poilult

- An Assistant Professor possessing the degree of Ph.D in the relevant (b) discipline and with regular service of 3 years' at AGP of Rs.6000/p.m. shall be eligible for moving to AGP of Rs.7000/-p.m.
 - (ii) An Assistant Professor possessing the degree of Ph.D in the relevant discipline and with regular service of 3 years' at AGP of Rs.7000/p.m. shall be eligible for moving to AGP of Rs.8000/- p.m.
 - (iii) An Assistant Professor possessing the degree of Ph.D in the relevant discipline and with regular service of 3 years' at AGP of Rs.8000/p.m. shall be eligible for moving to AGP of Rs.9000/- p.m., and redesignated as Associate Professor.
- (c). Associate Professor completing 4 years' of regular service in the AGP of Rs.9000/- and possessing a Ph.D degree in the relevant discipline shall be eligible to be appointed and designated as Professor, subject to other conditions of academic performance as laid down by the UGC and by the university, if any. No teacher other than those with a Ph.D shall be promoted, appointed or designated as Professor. The Pay Band for the post of Professors shall be Rs.37400-67000 with AGP of Rs.10000/- p.m.
- (d) Up to a maximum of 20% of the sanctioned post of Professors shall be placed in PB-4 in the AGP of Rs.12000/- p.m. after regular service of 6 years' as Professor in the AGP of Rs 10000 and the minimum pay in the Pay Band will be fixed at Rs.48000/- p.m.. Other eligibility conditions will be as laid down by the UGC.
- (e) All promotions will be based on performance evaluation and subject to fulfillment of other conditions laid down by MHRD letter No.1-32/2006-U.II/U.I (i) dated 31st December, 2008.
- Existing faculty of IIITs and ISMU, Dhanbad shall be given the replacement pay being proposed for IITs, as personal to them. Revised pay, as given in Para 2 above will be applicable for those recruited on or after the date of issue of these orders.
- Directors: As regards the Directors of the Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTIs), it was decided to follow a two-tier structure as in the case of faculty positions, as under:-
 - For Directors of IITs, IIMs, IISc Bangalore, IISERs, NITIE ,Mumbai, a fixed pay of Rs.80,000/- p.m.
 - (b) For Directors of NITs, IIITs, ISMU, Dhanbad, NIFFT, Ranchi, SPAs, SLIET, NERIST, CIT, NITTTRs, pay of Rs.75,000 plus Special Allowance of Rs.5000/- p.m. as applicable to Vice Chancellors of Universities.
- Cadre of Librarians and Directors of Physical Education will be given the revised pay and other benefits as notified vide MHRD letter No. 1-32/2006-U.II/U.I (i) dated 31st December, 2008. The qualifications and the age of superannuation (60 years) will remain unchanged. P. Dihahit

- 6. The revised pay of Scientific Officers/Design Staff shall be mapped into the normal replacement pay of 6th CPC. However, if the Scientific Officers / Design Saff are doing teaching work, their revised pay as approved for the teaching staff shall be applicable.
- 7. Faculty Structure: The flexible faculty structure will continue in those institutions where it is already in operation. However, institutions like ISMU/IIITs which were earlier under the IIT pay structure will have the same faculty structure as in UGC scheme except for the accelerated promotions as provided under Para 2 above. The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) will devise suitable academic criteria for those institutions which may like to change over to a four-tier flexible faculty structure.

8. Other service conditions:

- (i) Annual increment will be at the rate of 3% of the pay as per the CCS (RP). Rules, 2008 (pay in the pay band plus applicable AGP).
- (ii) Pay in the pay band and Academic Grade Pay shall not exceed the limits set in the CCS (RP) Rules, 2008 i.e. Rs.80000/-.
- (iii) A cumulative Professional Development Allowance for Rs.3 lakhs for every block period of 3 years (Rs. One lakh per year) may be made available to every member of the faculty on reimbursable basis to meet the expenses for participating in both national and international conferences, paying the membership fee of various professional bodies and contingent expenses.
- (iv) Revised pay scales will be effective from 1.1.2006 and other allowances from 1.9.2008 and pay of existing incumbents will be fixed as per the formula given in the CCS (RP) Rules, 2008 and the Fixation Table given in Annex-I of Ministry of Finance OM No.1/1/2008-IC dated 30th August, 2008. This is further subject to the proviso that the revised pay of existing incumbents as on 1.1.2006 will not be less than the minimum pay at the entry level for direct recruits in each category in the case of IITs, IIMs, IISc, IISERs and NITIE. This would effectively mean that:
 - a) Assistant Professors in the pre-revised scale of Rs.12.000 Rs.18.300 with basic pay ranging from Rs.12,000/- to Rs.15,780/- p.m. will be placed at the minimum of Rs.30,000/- p.m. For those incumbents with pre-revised basic pay of more than Rs.15780/-, their revised pay will be determined by multiplying the existing pay as on 1.1.2006 by a factor of 1.86 and rounding off the multiple figure to the next multiple of 10 as given in Rule 7 (1)(a)(i) of the CCS (RP) Rules, 2008.
 - b) In the case of Associate Professors in the pre-revised scale of Rs.16,400 Rs.20,000 with basic pay ranging from Rs.16,400/- to Rs.18,200/- p.m., the minimum will be fixed at Rs.42,800. For those incumbents with pre-revised pay of more than Rs.18200/-, the revised pay will be as per Fixation Table corresponding to pre-revised pay scale of S-26 as given in Annexure-I of Ministry of Finance's O.M.No.1/1/2008-IC dated 30th August, 2008.

- c) In the case of Professors in the pre-revised scale of Rs.18400-22400 with basic pay ranging from Rs.18400 to Rs.20400 p.m. will be placed at the minimum of Rs 48000/-. For those incumbents with pre-revised pay of more than Rs.20400/-, the revised pay will be as per Fixation Table corresponding to pre-revised pay scale of S-29 as given in Annexure-I of Ministry of Finance's O.M.No.1/1/2008-IC dated 30th August, 2008.
- (v) In respect of other categories of institutions, pay fixation will be made as per CCS (RP) Rules, 2008 and the Fitment table issued by MHRD for UGC funded institutions vide letter No.3-1/2009-U.I dated 4th June, 2009, which is available on the web-site of MHRD.
- 9. For Registrars, Dy. Registrar, Asstt. Registrar. UGC pay scales will apply to Registrar. Dy Registrars, Assistant Registrars of IITs, IISERs, NITs, IISc and Deemed to be Universities subject to they possessing the qualifications and experience as prescribed by UGC from time to time. For others, normal replacement scale as per CCS (RP) Rules, 2008 will apply. Age of superannuation will, however, continue to be 60 years.

- 10. Advance in connection with legal proceedings.

- 13. Advance for purchase of warm clothing.

- OM, dated 7-10-2008

Interest-bearing advances:

- 1. Advance to Postal and RMS Inspectors for purchase of typewriter.
- Advance for purchase of conveyance, i.e., motor car, motor cycle / moped, scooter.

- Advance for construction / purchase of house / flat / enlargement of living accommodation.

Amount.— Rs. 3,000.— Rule 58.

NOTE.—The rate of this advance should be increased by 25% whenever the Dearness Allowance payable on revised pay structure goes up by 50%.

Sanctioning Authority. - Head of Office. - Rule 53.

Festivals.— To be selected by Head of Department or Industrial Esta blishment in consultation with staff unions.—Rule 53, GID (1).

Eligibility.— 1. Non-Gazetted employees whose grade pay does not exceed Rs. 4,800.— Rule 53.

- 2. Staff in industrial establishment and work-charged staff entitled to pensior or CPF are eligible.— Explanation below Rule 53.
 - 3. Officials on EL/Maternity leave are eligible. Rule 54.

Not eligible .-

- 4. Temporary staff who are not likely to continue in service at least for six months beyond the month of drawing the advance are not eligible.— Rule 57.
 - 5. Officials under suspension are not eligible. Rule 54.
- Officials on Half Pay Leave or EOL or LPR at the time of payment are not eligible.— Rule 54.

Employee transferred during the year should certify non-drawal of advance in the previous office in that year.— Rule 55, GID (1).

Conditions.— 1. Admissible only once in a financial year even if the festival falls twice in the same year.— Rule 55.

- 2. Earlier advance, if any, should have been recovered in full.— Rule 56.
- 3. Should be drawn before the festival. The time-lag between dates of drawal and disbursement to be reduced to the minimum.—Rule 59 and GID below Rule 61.
- 4. Surety of a permanent Government servant is necessary in cases of temporary officials but can be waived if the authority is satisfied about full recovery / adjustment during temporary service.— Rule 5 and GID (1).

Recovery.— 1. Should commence with the issue of pay for the month following that in which the advance is drawn.— Rule 61.

Not more than 10 monthly instalments.— Rule 60.

Head of Account. — Debitable to the detailed head "Salaries". — G.I., M.F., O.M. No. F. 1 (27)-B (AC)/86, dated 19-9-1986.

3. Flood / Drought / Cyclone Advance

[Swamy's — GFR and Compendium on Advances and OM, dated 7-10-2008]

Sanctioning Authority.— Head of Office.— Rule 64.

Conditions.— 1. Only non-Gazetted employees whose movable / immovable property has been substantially affected or damaged in an area affected by natural calamity, are eligible.— Rule 64.

- 2. The concerned State Government should have declared the area as having been affected by natural calamity, i.e., flood, drought or cyclone, as the case may be, and granted similar advance to their employees.—Rule 64.
- 3. Staff in industrial establishments and work-charged staff entitled to pension or CPF benefits are eligible. Staff paid from contingencies are not eligible.— Explanation below Rule 64.
- 4. Application should be given in Form IX of the Compendium within three months of the date of Government orders declaring the natural calamity.—

 Rules 64 and 65.
- 5. If the official's declaration in the application regarding damage to his property is found untrue, he is liable for disciplinary action.— Rule 64, GID (2).

Amount of advance.— 1. Limited to Rs. 5,000 — Rule 66.

NOTE.— The rate of this advance should be increased by 25% whenever the Dearness Allowance payable on revised pay structure goes up by 50%.

Second advance normally not sanctioned. If second / subsequent grant
of advance becomes necessary before the earlier advance is fully recovered, the
advance will be limited as under—

Eligibility.— Central Government servants for whom training in 'Prabodh', 'Praveen' and 'Pragya' is obligatory and who undergo training through Correspondence Course conducted by the Central Hindi Directorate.

Amount.— Rs. 150.

Sanctioning Authority.— Head of Office.

Conditions.— 1. Advance is granted only after three months from the start of the Correspondence Course.

The Government servant should make a satisfactory progress in training.
 For this purpose, the sanctioning authority may seek a certificate from the Central Hindi Directorate that the progress of the employee is satisfactory.

Adjustment of advance.— Adjustable / recoverable from the cash award admissible to the trainee on passing the concerned examination. If the trainee

does not pass the examination, the amount of advance shall be recovered in four equal instalments after the declaration of the result.

Head of Account.— Debitable to "7610 — Loans to Government servants, etc.— Other Advances— Loans for training of Prabodh, Praveen and Pragya".— Order 12, Appendix-7.

5. Warm Clothing Advance

[Swamy's — GFR and Compendium on Advances and OM, dated 7-10-2008]

Amount. - Maximum of Rs. 3,000 - Rule 35.

NOTE.—The rate of this advance should be increased by 25% whenever the Dearness Allowance payable on revised pay structure goes up by 50%.

Hill Station.— Places which are situated at a height of 1,000 metres or more above sea-level are to be treated as hill stations for grant of warm clothing advance.— Rule 33, GlO (1).

Eligibility.— All Groups 'C' and 'D' employees posted at a hill station either on first appointment or on transfer, for a period of not less than one year.— Rule 33.

Condition.— The Head of Office should certify that the official is likely to stay at the hill station for not less than twelve months including period of stay already elapsed.— Rule 34.

Second / subsequent advance.— May be granted after elapse of three years since the grant of earlier advance.— Rule 34.

Interest.— No interest for advance sanctioned from 7-10-2008.

Recovery.— In not more than ten equal monthly instalments to commence with the first issue of pay after the advance is drawn.— Rules 36 and 37.

Sanctioning Authority.— Head of Office.— Rule 33.

6. Fan Advance

[ABOLISHED from 1-9-2008 vide G.I., M.F., O.M. No. 12 (1)/E.II (A)/2008, dated 7-10-2008]

7. Typewriter Advance

[Swamy's - P & T, FHB, Volume-I]

Eligibility.— Inspector, Post / Inspector, RMS, should hold a substantive appointment.— Rule 421-A.

Amount.— Rs. 1,500 or anticipated price of typewriter, whichever is less.— Rule 421-A (b).

Conditions.— 1. The Head of Department should satisfy himself that the possession of the typewriter by the official is in public interest.

- The typewriter should be purchased within a month of receipt of the advance; otherwise the advance should be refunded together with interest thereon for one month.
- 3. The official should execute an agreement at the time of drawing the advance and mortgage the typewriter after purchase as in the case of conveyance. Rule 421-A (a), (g) & (h):

Second advance.— Ordinarily not admissible within five years of the grant of a previous advance. The amount of the first advance together with interest thereon should have been fully repaid.— Rule 421-A (k) (i) and (ii).

Recovery.— In not more than 30 instalments; fraction, if any, to be adjusted in the last instalments.— Rule 421-A (d).

Interest.— As prescribed by Government from time to time. It should be recovered in one instalment—Rule 421-A (e).

8. Conveyance Advance — General

[Swamy's — GFR and Compendium on Advances]

General conditions. — For grant of advance to employees for purchase of Motor Car / Motor Cycle / Scooter, etc. —

- 1. The authority competent to sanction the advance is Department of Central Government / Administrator / Head of Department.—
 Rule 15 (1).
- He should be satisfied about the applicant's repaying capacity.— Rule 17.
- 3. Officials without substantive appointment should furnish Surety Bond in Form I from a permanent official of status equal to or higher than the applicant himself.— Rule 5.
- 4. The advance should not be sanctioned or disbursed to an official under suspension.— Rule 22.
- The advance can be granted only if the outstanding balance, if any, in respect of an advance previously granted for the same purpose, together with interest thereon, has been fully repaid.— Rule 19.
- 6. The advance cannot be granted if the vehicle has been purchased already and paid for, unless it has been purchased and paid for by raising temporary loan within three months from the date the advance was applied for.— Rule 18.
- 7. Prior permission for, or intimation of, the purchase of the vehicle is necessary under the Conduct Rules.

- Purchase of the vehicle should be made within one month from the date of drawal of the advance — exception Item 6 above.— Rule 28.
- Registration Certificate of the vehicle in his name should be produced within a month of purchase, or within two months from the date of drawal of the advance, failing which penal interest from the date of drawal of the advance to the date of production of RC will be levied.— Rule 28, GID (4).
- The Motor Car should, after purchase, be mortgaged to the President.— Rule 29.
- Recovery of the advance will commence with the first issue of pay and/or leave salary or subsistence allowance after drawal of advance.— Rule 24.
- 12. Simple interest at the rate prescribed for the purpose, will be charged on the balance outstanding on the last date of each month and will be recovered in one or more instalments after complete repayment of the principal. The amount of each such instalment should be not greater than the amount fixed for repayment of principal.— Rules 20, 25 & 26.
- Sanction should indicate the interest at 2½% more than the
 prescribed rate with a stipulation that a rebate of 2½% will be
 allowed for prompt repayment and observing of other conditions.—
 Rule 2, GID.
- 14. Interest may be calculated by applying the following formulae:-
 - (i) Principal repaid in equal instalments from month to month-

Interest =
$$\frac{n(n+1)}{2} \times \frac{x}{12} \times \frac{r}{100}$$

(ii) Portion of the principal is paid in equal monthly instalments, and the balance is paid in lumpsum—

Interest =
$$\frac{1}{2} (a+l) \times \frac{r}{100} \times \frac{1}{12}$$

(iii) Repayment is not fegular-

The balances outstanding on the last day of each month should be added up. Then—

Interest = Total interest bearing balance x $\frac{1}{12}$ x $\frac{r}{100}$

Where n — No. of instalments including last instalment of lumpsum payment, if any.

a — Amount of principal.

x — Amount of each instalment of repayment.

r — Rate of interest.

Last balance for which interest is due.

NOTES.— 1. Recovery made from the pay for a month is deemed to be made on the first of the succeeding month.

- 2. The amount recovered from pay and any lumpsum payment(s) during that particular month should be taken as one instalment; e.g., when an instalment is recovered from pay for April, paid on 30th April, if the balance is repaid in lumpsum any time (in one or more instalments) during April, the recovery through pay bill and the lumpsum payment(s) should all be taken as one instalment, for formula (ii).
 - 15. The prescribed rates of interest chargeable in respect of the advance drawn during different years are—

16. Prior sanction of Competent Authority is necessary to sell or transfer the vehicle before repayment of the advance with interest thereon. The sale proceeds in such cases should be applied towards repayment of the advance with interest, to the extent necessary.— Rule 27, GIO (2).

9. Motor Car Advance

[Swamy's — GFR and Compendium on Advances]

- 1. Eligibility.— Officers drawing Pay in the Pay Band Rs. 19,530 or more are eligible for the grant of the advance. This may be relaxed by the Secretary to the Ministry / Department in deserving cases.— Rule 17 (ii) and GID.
- 2. Amount.— On the first occasion restricted to Rs. 1,80,000 or eight months' Pay in the Pay Band or the price of the car to be purchased, whichever is the least.

On the second / subsequent occasions, restricted to Rs. 1,60,000 or eight months' Pay in the Pay Band or the price of the car to be purchased, whichever is the least.— Rule 21 (1) & (2).

Second / subsequent advance for the purchase of a different type of vehicle is admissible without selling the previous vehicle, but the balance of the previous advance with interest should be repaid in full.—Rule 21 (2), Note 2.

Second or every subsequent advance for the purchase of motor car will be admissible only after four years from the date of drawal of the earlier advance; this condition will not apply—

- if the preceding advance was for motor cycle and the second advance is for a motor car;
- (ii) when a Government servant disposes of his motor car in India prior to deputation / training abroad lasting for more than a year and returns to India without a car;
- (iii) when a Government servant is appointed to a regular post abroad and does not take his car along with him.— Rule 21 (2).

For officers of the Indian Foreign Service or Central Government servants holding regular posts abroad, the amount of advance will be as per Para. 2 above or the amount admissible from the foreign exchange angle, whichever is less.—

Rule 21 (3), Note 3.

3. Advance for paying customs duty.— A Government servant who is holding a regular post abroad for a period exceeding one year and who is otherwise eligible for the grant of motor car advance may be granted an advance in two instalments— first at the time of purchase of the car and second at the time of payment of customs duty when the car is brought to India on completion of his tenure. The quantum of advance will be as per Para. 2 above.— Rule 21 (3).

If a Government servant who has not availed motor car advance earlier brings a car along with him, he may be granted advance in one lumpsum for payment of customs duty levied on the car. The quantum will be Rs. 1,80,000 or eleven months' Pay in the Pay Band or the actual customs duty, whichever is the least.— Rule 21 (4).

- 4. Repayment.— In not more than 200 equal monthly instalments. The Government servant may at his option repay more than one instalment in a month. Recovery should start from the first issue of pay / leave salary / subsistence allowance after the drawal of advance.—Rules 23 and 24.
- 5. Interest.— To be recovered in minimum number of monthly instalments. Amount of each instalment to be not greater than the amount fixed for repayment of principal.— Rule 25.
- 6. If the advance is drawn in more than one instalment, the rate of interest is determined with reference to the date of drawal of first instalment.— Rule 20, GID (3).

10. Personal Computer Advance

[Swamy's - GFR and Compendium on Advances]

Eligibility.— Same as for Motor Car Advance. However, a Government servant whose Pay in the Pay Band is Rs. 8,560 or more is eligible for the grant of an advance not exceeding Rs. 30,000 or the anticipated price of the computer, whichever is less.—Rule 21 (5) and OM, dated 12-12-2008.

Sanctioning Authority. - Same as for Motor Car Advance.

Amount.— Rs. 80,000 on the first occasion and Rs. 75,000 on second or subsequent occasions or the anticipated price of the computer (excluding customs duty, if any), whichever is less.

Conditions.— 1. An application for the grant of advance for the purchase of a Personal Computer shall be made in Form VI of the Compendium.

- A second or subsequent advance for the purchase of a Personal Computer cannot be granted before the expiry of 3 years from the date of drawal of the earlier advance.
- 3. Advance not admissible for payment of customs duty on the Personal Computer.— Rule 21 (5).

Mortgage. — Same as for Motor Car Advance. Instead of Chassis No. and Engine No., the Make, Model and No. of the Personal Computer should be entered in Form IV of the Compendium.

Interest. - Same as for Motor Car Advance.

Repayment.— In not more than 150 monthly instalments. Total recoveries on account of all advances including computer advance, taken by a Government servant shall not exceed 50% of the total emoluments.— Rule 21 (5).

11. Motor Cycle / Scooter Advance

[Swamy's — GFR and Compendium on Advances]

Eligibility.— Officials drawing Pay in the Pay Band Rs. 8,560 or more. This may be relaxed by the sanctioning authority in deserving cases.— Rule 17 (iii) and GID.

Officials having Pay in the Pay Band below Rs. 8,560 p.m. are eligible for an advance of Rs. 20,000 or the anticipated price, whichever is less for the purchase of Moped.— Rule 17 (iv) and GID.

Sanctioning Authority. - Same as for Motor Car Advance.

Amount.— On the first occasion restricted to Rs. 30,000 or 4 months' Pay in the Pay Band or the anticipated price of motor cycle / scooter / moped, whichever is the least.

On second / subsequent occasions restricted to Rs. 24,000 or 3 months' Pay in the Pay Band or the price of motor cycle / scooter to be purchased, whichever is the least.— Rule 30.

Second / subsequent advance for purchase of a different type of vehicle, viz., motor car, is admissible without selling the vehicle previously purchased with advance from Government; but the balance of the previous advance with interest should be repaid in full.— Rule 21 (2), Note 2.

Repayment.— In not more than 70 equal monthly instalments.— Rule 30.

12. Cycle Advance

[Swamy's - GFR and Compendium on Advances and OM, dated 7-10-2008]

Eligibility.— Non-Gazetted Government servants whose grade pay does not exceed Rs. 2,800.— Rule 31.

Sanctioning Authority. Head of the Office. Rule 15 (2).

Amount.— Rs. 3,000 or the anticipated price including sales tax, whichever is less.— Rule 31, proviso.

NOTE.—The rate of this advance should be increased by 25% whenever the Dearness Allowance payable on revised pay structure goes up by 50%.

Conditions.— 1. Should furnish cash receipt and particulars of the cycle within one month of drawing the advance.

- 2. Subsequent advance will not ordinarily be admissible within 3 years of the first advance
- 3. Priority to be given to those who have not availed the advance during the preceding five years.— Rule 32, GID (2).
 - 4. Cannot be granted to an official under suspension.
- 5. Cannot be granted if the bicycle has already been purchased and paid for, unless it was purchased and paid for by raising temporary loan within 3 months from the date the advance was applied for.— Rule 18.

Repayment.— In not more than 30 equal monthly instalments.— Rule 31, proviso.

Recovery will commence with the first issue of pay and/or leave salary or subsistence allowance after drawal of the advance.—Rule 24.

Interest.— No interest for advance sanctioned from 7-10-2008.

13. House Building Advance

[Swamy's - House Building Advance Rules]

Eligibility.—

1. All permanent officials

- 2. Officials with at least 10 years' continuous service. Past military service of re-employed Ex-Servicemen will be reckoned for counting the minimum period of 10 years. The sanctioning authority should be satisfied about the official's likely retention in service till the house is completely built and mortgaged to Government.
- Members of All India Services (viz., IAS, IPS, etc.) deputed for service under Central Government, Public Sector Undertakings

under the control of Central Government, International Organization, Autonomous Body or a Private Body.

 Central Government servants on deputation to another department or on foreign service. (These cases should be processed by the Head of the parent Department.)

- Staff Artistes of All India Radio with at least 10 years' continuous service and are on long-term contract.
- 6. Staff covered under Payment of Wages Act.
- 7. If both husband and wife are Government servants, advance is admissible to only one of them.
- 8. Employees of Union Territories. Rule 1.

Purposes .-

- 1. Acquiring a plot and constructing a house thereon.
- 2. Constructing a new house on the plot already owned by the official or jointly with his / her spouse.
- Getting a plot under Co-operative Schemes and building a house, where title will vest in the official after the house is built.
- Enlarging living accommodation in an existing house owned by the official or jointly with spouse. The total cost of the existing structure (excluding cost of land) and the proposed additions should not exceed the prescribed cost ceiling.
- 5. Conversion of hire-purchase into outright purchase of house / flat from State Housing Boards or similar Government-controlled Bodies, and outright purchase of new ready-built house or flat from Government, semi-Government or Local Bodies, Housing Boards, Development Authorities, etc., and from private parties, i.e., registered builders, architects, house building societies, etc., and not private individuals.
- 6. Purchase of house / flat under 'Self-Financing Housing Schemes' and 'Co-operative Group Housing Societies'.
- 7. Repayment of a loan taken from Government / private source or from HUDCO for house construction, even if the construction has already commenced, but only if the official had applied for HBA before availing such loan.—Rule 3, GIOs 9 and 10.
- Constructing the residential portion alone of the building on a plot which is earmarked as a shop-cum-residential plot in a residential colony.
- For purchase of house / flat from private parties, i.e., registered builders, architects, house building societies, etc., but not from private individuals.

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Conditions.— 1. The official should not have availed of any loan or advance for the purpose from any other Government source, Housing Board, other semi-Government or Local Bodies, Development Authorities, etc. Where such loan has been availed of, HBA can be granted if the Government servant undertakes to repay the outstanding loan forthwith in one lumpsum.

- The official or spouse or minor child should not already own a house in the town / urban agglomeration where the house is proposed to be constructed or acquired.
- 3. If the official is a member of HUF, which owns a house at the same place, he may be granted advance restricted to 60% of the normal entitlement.—

 Rule 2, GIO (3).
 - 4. The title to the land should be clear.
- 5. Advance for ready-built house or flat is admissible for outright purchase only.
- 6. Cost ceiling.— Cost of the house (excluding cost of land) should not exceed 134 times of the Pay in the Pay Band of the official, subject to a minimum of Rs. 7.5 lakhs and a maximum of Rs. 30 lakhs.

The cost ceiling may be relaxed up to 25% in individual cases based on merit by the Administrative Ministry concerned.— OMs, dated 15-10-2004 and 27-11-2008.

Minimum cost-ceiling need not be insisted.— Rule 2, GIOs (4) and (5).

If both husband and wife are employed in Central / State Government, Public Undertakings, semi-Government Institutions or Local Bodies, the pay of both of them will be taken into consideration for calculating the cost ceiling.— Rule 2, GIO (2).

In respect of the Self-Financing Housing Scheme notified by DDA, etc., the cost ceiling should be taken as inclusive of land and development charges.—

Rule 2 (a).

- 7. In the case of enlargement to existing accommodation, the total cost of the existing structure and the cost of enlargement should not exceed the limit in 6 above.— Rule 3 (b).
- 8. If GPF withdrawal is also taken for house building, the total amount of GPF withdrawal and the House Building Advance should not exceed the cost-ceiling limit (6 above).— Rule 2 (a).
- If the advance is for constructing residential part of the building on a shop-cum-residential plot situated in a residential colony—
 - (a) the cost of land and the cost of superstructures of the proposed residential portion and shop(s) should not exceed the ceiling limit.

- (b) the entire property including the shop(s) and the residential portion should be mortgaged.
- (c) the entire building including the shop(s) should be insured against fire, lightning, floods, etc.— Rule 2, GIO (1).
- 10. House / Flat constructed / acquired with the help of HBA to be used for residential purpose only.— Rule 3, GIO (14).

Amount of advance.— 1. In the following cases, the amount of advance admissible is 34 times of the Pay in the Pay Band of the official or Rs. 7.50 lakhs, or cost of the house or repaying capacity, whichever is least.

- (a) Construction of a new house on an existing plot.
- (b) Purchasing a plot and constructing a house thereon.
- (c) Purchase of a ready-built house or flat. Rule 4.
- For enlarging living accommodation in an existing house, the amount admissible is 34 times of the Pay in the Pay Band or Rs. 1,80,000 or repaying capacity, whichever is the least.
- 3. In case of construction of a house in a rural area, the advance sanctioned will be the least of 80% of cost or 34 times of Pay in the Pay Band or Rs. 7,50,000. For enlarging the existing living accommodation in a rural area, the ceiling will be the least of 80% of cost or 34 times of Pay in the Pay Band or Rs. 1,80,000.— Rule 4, GID (4).
 - 4. The advance will be limited to the estimated cost of construction.
- 5. Family pension at normal rates drawn by a Government servant will be clubbed with basic pay for computing amount of advance as well as cost ceiling.—
 Rule 4, GIO (5).
 - 6. Only one advance is admissible during the entire service.— Rule 4.
- The amount of advance shall be restricted to the repaying capacity of the official.
- 8. The amount of advance sanctioned can be reduced at the request of the Government servants to avail of the reduced rate of interest, if the entire advance has not been drawn.— Rule 4, GIO (2).

Repaying Capacity:

The repaying capacity of the official will be computed on the following basis:—

Length of remaining service	Repaying capacity
Officials fetiring after 20 years. Officials retiring after 10 years but not later than 20 years.	40% of (basic pay + NPA) 40% of (basic pay + NPA) 65% of Retirement Gratuity may also be adjusted.

9. No enhancement of HBA in case of subsequent revision of DCRG limits.—Rule 4, GID (3).

Disbursement of advance:-

For enlargement / construction.— Single / Double-storeyed.— 50% on execution of the mortgage deed in all cases. Balance 50% on the construction reaching plinth level for enlargement of ground floor / construction reaching roof level for enlargement in upper floor.

For purchase of land and construction.— Single-storeyed house.— 40% or the actual cost of the plot for purchase of plot on execution of agreement in Form 5 and production of Surety Bond, 50% of the balance on execution of the mortgage deed and the balance, on the construction reaching plinth level.— Rule 5 (a) (1).

For purchase of land and construction.— Double-storeyed house.— 30% or the actual cost of plot on executing the agreement, 50% of the balance on execution of the mortgage deed and the balance on the construction reaching plinth level.— Rule 5 (a) (3).

For purchase / construction of flat or purchase of a house.— In one lumpsum.— Rule 5 (a) (5).

For purchase of house / flat from Co-operative Group Housing Societies.— 30% on execution of mortgage deed and the balance in suitable instalments on receipt of demand.

Time-limits for utilization of advance:

- Purchase of land.— Should be completed and the Sale Deed produced within 2 months, failing which the advances should be refunded in lump.
- 2. Purchase of house.— Acquisition and mortgage to Government should be completed within 3 months. Extension of time-limit may be granted by Heads of Departments.
- 3. Purchase / construction of new flat. Should be utilized within one month, unless extension of time-limit is granted. Rules 5 (a), (6) (a).

Surety in certain cases.— In addition to execution of mortgage / agreement, the surety of an approved permanent official is necessary before releasing the sanctioned advance or any part thereof to—

- (a) Officials who are not permanent.
- (b) Officials due to retire from service within 18 months following the date of application for advance.

(c) Permanent officials [not covered by (b) above] requiring the advance for the purchase of a ready-built house.— Rule 5 (b) (1).

Collateral Security.— For constructing or purchasing ready-built flat officials should furnish adequate collateral security as laid down under Ru 274 of the General Financial Rules to the satisfaction of the Head of th Department, in cases where the land on which the flats stand is not mortgage by the owner of the land in favour of the President of India as security toward repayment of the advance.— Rule 5 (6) (b) (2).

Construction:

- 1. Adherence to Plans.— The construction should be exactly accordin to the approved plan and specification, on the basis of which the advance wa sanctioned. Prior concurrence of the Ministry of Urban Development is necessar for any deviation.— Rule 7 (a) (i).
- 2. Time-limit.— The construction should be completed within 18 month of the date on which the first instalment is drawn. Extension of time-limit i permissible up to one year by the Head of Department and for a longer period by the Government if the work is delayed due to circumstances beyond the Government servant's control.— Rule 7 (a) (ii).
- 3. Insurance.— On completion of construction / purchase, the house should be insured by the official at his cost against fire, flood and lightning for the full value of the house. The Insurance policy should be deposited with the Government and the premia receipts should be produced for inspection. The insurance should be kept alive till liquidation of advance.— Rule 7 (b).

The employees may get their house / flat insured from any of the four Nationalized General Insurance Companies of their choice, irrespective of its location in India.— OM, dated 29-9-2004.

Separate insurance of flats / houses acquired through membership of Co-operative Group Housing Societies not necessary.— Rule 7, GID (7).

4. Maintenance.— The house should be maintained in good repair at owner's cost and kept free from all encumbrances. The official should pay all taxes regularly and furnish a certificate annually to that effect. Annual inspection may be carried out by the Head of the Department for checking up the maintenance.— Rule 7 (c) and (d).

Second Mortgage:

Creation of Second charge.— If an employee wants to avail of a further loan (in addition to the HBA) from any financial institution, he may create a second charge on the property subject to the following conditions:—

 Loan to be obtained should be from recognized financial institutions like Banks, Government Financial Corporations, Co-operative

- The total HBA taken plus the amount of loan now raised should not exceed the prescribed cost ceiling.
- Second charge can be created in respect of loan for meeting the balance cost of the house / flat.
- Second charge can be created also for enlargement of living accommodation in the house constructed / acquired with HBA, if two years have elapsed after completion of the house constructed with HBA— Rule 3, GID (13).
- Prior permission of the Head of Department should be obtained.— Rule 5, GID (12).

Assignment of employee's interest in Group Insurance Scheme, 1980.—
An employee who is a member of the Central Government Employees' Group Insurance Scheme, 1980, can assign his interest in the insurance cover and accumulation in the Savings Fund as a security to the financial institution for obtaining additional loan from them for acquiring / building a flat / house subject to conditions 1 to 4 above.

The communication of acceptance of the assignment should be entered in the Service Record in red ink.

Interest.— The advances carry simple interest from the date of payment of the first instalment and is calculated on the balance outstanding on the last day of each month.—Rule 6.

No interest is chargeable beyond the date of retirement / death of the Government servant.— Rule 8, GID (1).

- (c) In the case of ready-built house or flat, recovery will commence from the pay for the month following that in which the advance is taken.— Rule 8 (a), Note (ii).

Adjustment of a portion from retirement / death gratuity.— In the case of employees retiring within 20 years, a portion of the advance and/or interest may be left to be adjusted from the retirement / death gratuity if a suitable clause to that effect is inserted in the mortgage deed.— Rule 8 (a), Note (iv).

Failure to repay.— If the officials fails to repay the balance of the advance on or before the date of retirement, Government may enforce recovery from retirement / death gratuity or by sale of the house or in any other manner.— $Rule\ 8\ (a), Note\ (v).$

Manner of recovery.—Recovery will be effected through monthly pay/leave salary or subsistence allowance bills. Recovery cannot be postponed without the prior concurrence of Government.—Rule 8 (b).

A. Grant of special allowance, Dy. Directors/Wardens etc.

Keeping in view the Special Allowance of Rs.4000/- prescribed for Pro- Vice Chancellor, Ministry has suggested vide it is letter dated 9th March,2010 that the Dy. Directors may be paid a monthly special allowance of Rs.4000/- per month. Accordingly, it has been felt that the honorarium for Deans, Wardens etc. may be suitably revised keeping in view the existing norms. Accordingly, honorarium/special allowances in respect of Dy. Directors, Deans, Wardens etc. will be as under:-

Even though academic grade pay has been fixed slightly at a higher level than the grade pay fixed for similar grade of Central Government employees, the entitlement for TA/DA and other allowances would be governed by the provision of the CCS (RP) Rules, 2008 as per the TA/DA entitlement for corresponding Grade Pay Accordingly, the following mapping of academic grade pay with grade pay is required to be followed for the purpose of determining eligibility for TA/DA and other allowances:

The conditions for moving to the new HAG scale will remain exactly the same as the movement from AGP of Rs.10,500/-to AGP of Rs.12,000/-. Further, as indicated in this Ministry's letter of even number, dated 18.8.2010, this will have prospective effect from the date of issue of orders regarding revision of scales of pay, i.e. 18.8.2009.

The Chairman welcomed all the members and asked the Director to begin with the progress report of the Institute.

The Director welcomed members of the Finance Committee and presented a report on the progress of the Institute and the developments that took place during the period of July 21, 2009 – February 25, 2010.

Members expressed their satisfaction on the performance of the Institute on plan grant utilization.

However, members were of the view that construction activity should be further intensified. The Director informed the members that several proposals are underway and would be presented in the next meeting. Members also noted with satisfaction Institute's move on filling up of the vacant posts. Further, member expressed their concern over the delay in the audit report and advised the Institute to approach the AG office to get the audit report of 2008-09 at the earliest.

Minutes of 2009/2nd Finance Committee meeting held on 20th July 2009 were confirmed.

FC/2010:01.04: Recommendations of the Building & Works Committee held on 16th February 2010

The Finance Committee deliberated on the following recommendations of the Building and Works Committee and decided on each of the item as mentioned below.

(a) B&WC/2010:01:03: To consider Preliminary Estimates for the construction work of Narmada Residency-II (50 Nos of Flats)

The recommendations of B&WC for construction of 50 Nos of flats of Narmada Residency-II with a Preliminary Estimate (PE) amounting to Rs. 1598 Lacs (Rs One thousand five hundred ninety eight lacs only), including architects fee@ 5% (plus service tax as applicable on fees) and 3% contingencies were further recommended to the BOG for Administrative Approval and Financial Sanction (A/A & F/S).

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Pandit Dwarka Prasad Mishra, Indian Institute of Information Technology, Design and Manufacturing (PDPM-IIIT, DM). Jabalpur as at 31 March 2009 and the Income & Expenditure Account/Receipt & Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20 (1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The Audit has been entrusted for the period up to 2013-14. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects etc. if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/ CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:

- (i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit,
- (ii) The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account/Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India.

- (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Institute in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- (iv) We further report that: -

A. Balance Sheet

1.1 Non provision of liabilities for retirement benefits on actuarial valuation.

A provision for retirement benefits is required to be made every year on the basis of its valuation by an actuary, which has not been done.

B. Revision of Accounts

The Institute revised its Receipts & Payments account at the instance of Audit. The effect of the revision was that the Receipts were increased by Rs.2420/- and the Payments total was corrected from the incorrect figure of Rs.30, 72,10,397 to the correct figure of Rs.30, 78,14,022. However, the revision had no effect on the Income & Expenditure Account and the Balance Sheet.

C. General

The Audit Report for the year 2007-08 has been presented before the Parliament, without its adoption by the Board of Governors.

D. Grant in aid

During the year 2008-09, Institute had received grant-in-aid (Plan) of Rs.23.92 crore from Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, New Delhi and had unspent balance of Rs.0.56 crore of previous year. Out of total available funds of Rs.24.48 crore, the Institute could utilize a sum of Rs.20.51 crore leaving unutilized balance of Rs.3.97 crore, as on 31.03.2009.

E. Management Letter: -

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Director, PDPM-IIIT,DM, Jabalpur through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

Adequacy of Internal Control System.

The Institute is yet to frame its own rules & byelaws as required under its memorandum of Association. No rules have been framed/adopted for maintenance of files, procedure for Departmental promotion committee and procedure for assets maintenance.

Adequacy of Internal Audit System.

The Institute has not prepared its Internal Audit Manual.

3. System of Physical Verification of Assets.

Physical verification of assets had not been conducted during the year except for library books.

4. System of Physical Verification of Inventories.
