Senate/53/01	Overview report by the Chairperson of the Senate.
The overview report by the Chairperson Senate was presented during the meeting.	
Senate/53/02	Confirmation of the Minutes of the 52 nd Meeting of the Senate held on July 27, 2023

The Senate confirmed the minutes of the 52nd meeting of the Senate with following modifications:

1. Agenda Senate/52/07, Department to be replaced with Discipline.
Accordingly point (ii) on page 5 will be:
"While allocation of PhD students at the Discipline level, the Discipline Heads must ensure that such faculty members should get preference on priority basis and also get one PhD student which is necessary for their academic growth".
2. Senate/52/09 following line will be added:
"This will be effective with immediate effect for all batches".
3. Senate/52/13 following line will be added:
"The total duration of fellowship (Project + Institute Assistantship) will be equivalent to the duration of fellowship for the regular students admitted under the Institute Assistantship category which is currently five years."

The Senate recommended the proposed guidelines to the Board of Governors for the approval. The Senate further recommended the same to be extended to the Master's students to be admitted under the category.

The Senate approved the Academic Calendar for the Academic Year 2024-25 with modifications. The modified Academic Calendar is attached as Annexure III (revised).

Modification in the policy related to the strength of the students in elective courses for the UG students

The Senate approved the proposed guidelines with following modifications:

- a) Upper cap for the UG elective courses: 90
- c) Lower cap for the UG elective courses: 15

Further, the Senate authorized Chairperson Senate to provide approval for the courses beyond the limits particularly the cases due to the prerequisite requirements in the courses. The Senate decided that the proposed guidelines will be effective from the Semester II (even semester), Academic Year 2024-25 onwards for all batches.

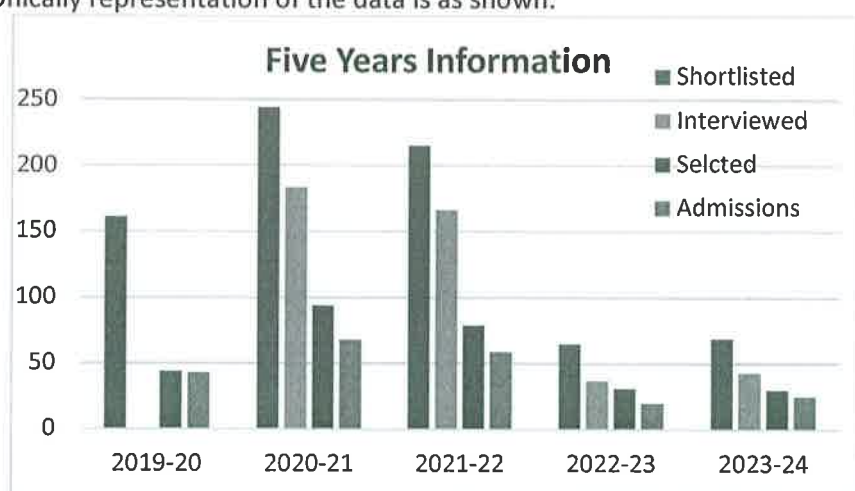

Senate/53/13	Guidelines related to the change of supervisor in the case of change of job/institute by a faculty
<p>The senate approved the proposed guidelines with following modifications in para 5 (modified para reproduced here):</p> <p>"In case a faculty acting as a supervisor of a Ph.D. student changes job/ institute before the end of the fourth semester of the program of a Ph.D. student, the DPGC will suggest a new supervisor in discussion with the student and the supervisor of the student will be changed. The existing supervisor no longer will continue as supervisor or co-supervisor. However, he can become an external supervisor if more than 50% of the thesis work has been completed. This requires approval from the Dean Academic on the recommendation of the DPGC. In this case the entire responsibility of the student will lie with the new supervisor."</p> <p>The Senate decided to implement it with immediate effect.</p>	
Senate/53/14	Change in guidelines for formation of the RPC of a Ph.D. student
The agenda item was withdrawn.	
Senate/53/15	Admission to the candidates who have not qualified Gate/CEED/UGC/CSIR-NET/JRF in the Masters' and Ph.D. programs
<p>The Senate noted that the proposal was sent to the Board of Governors earlier also. However, the Senate decided to put the request again before the Board of Governors due to following reasons:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In the last three years, the number of students getting admission in Masters' and Ph.D. program 	




have drastically decreased. A summary of number of applications received for the July/August session and admissions offered in last five years is presented here:

- The trend is global and few other reputed CFTIs have also opened the admission for the candidates who have not qualified Gate/CEED/UGC/CSIR-NET/JRF. - The Ministry of Education letter No. F.No. 12-2/2023-U! dated 11th September 2023 mentions that "The selection process through National level examinations conducted by MoE and its Agencies and Institutions such as UGC/IIT/IISc./IISER/IIIT etc."

To meet the requirement, for such candidates, a separate admission test equivalent to Gate/CEED/UGC/CSIR-NET/JRF will be conducted at the Institute level. A minimum threshold as a qualifying marks should be decided by the committee that sets the exam paper. However, preference will be given to the candidates having qualified Gate/CEED/UGC/CSIR-NET/JRF.


The Senate recommends that such admitted students will get the Institute assistantship equivalent to the Gate/CEED/UGC/CSIR-NET/JRF qualified students.

The Senate recommended the proposal for the consideration of the BoG and approval. It is proposed to start admissions under the category for the coming semester (Semester I, 2024-25).

The Senate recommended the proposal to the Board of Governors for the approval in principle. PIC Alumni was requested to work out the modalities related to the award.	
Senate/53/17	Approval of the courses recommended by the APCS
The senate approved the list of courses recommended by the APCS.	
Senate/53/18	Ratification of the Items
The Senate ratified the decisions taken by the Chairperson Senate except the item no 20: Guidelines for the backlog/ improvement courses. The Senate decided that the guidelines will be effective only in case the student registering for a course under these guidelines have registered for the course during regular semester and appeared for the end semester examination of the course during the regular semester. Student will not be allowed during the summer term to register for the courses which are dropped during the regular semester due to any reason, including indiscipline.

Senate/53/19.1	List of Medal Awardees 2022-23
For the batch passed out in the year 2023, the medal awardee list as recommended by the committees was placed before the Senate. The Senate advised that the list be circulated to all members with committees report and comments/ suggestions be invited from the members. The members will give their opinion within three days of circulation and after considering the opinion, the Chairperson Senate is authorized to recommend the same to the Board of Governors.	
Senate/53/19.2	Internship for the M.Des. Students
The Senate approved the proposal for the internship for the M.Des. students. The same will be available during the final semester only.	
Senate/53/19.3	Senate nominee to the BoG
<p>As per the Institute Act clause 13(h) the Senate is empowered to nominate two Professors of the Institute to the Board of Governors. The term of office of a member nominated under clause (h) of sub-section (2) of section 13 shall be two years from the date of nomination.</p> <p>The term of the existing members is already over.</p> <p>The senate nominated following members to the Board of Governors:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Prof. Pritee Khanna, Professor, Computer Science and Engineering 2. Prof. Prabin Kumar Padhy, Professor, Electronics and Communication Engineering
