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<p>2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.</p>	<p>Q1. What measures have been /are being taken by the Institute to minimize the impact of COVID-19 on the education system/ academic calendar in the country. After receiving the instructions from the Ministry, the Institute has switched to online mode. The classes were conducted in online mode and exams were also conducted via online mode. All the examinations were successfully completed by June 27, 2020. A special grade "Special Satisfactory grade" was introduced so that the students at remote areas or with poor power and internet facility should not suffer. Current semester has also started in online mode from August 14, 2020 (except for the first year). For the benefit of the students, semester is divided into four quarters and each quarter is evaluated separately. In addition to online classes, labs are also running via online demonstration mode. The semester will be ending in December and the next semester will start on time as expected. For the UG and Master's program admissions are being conducted via online mode by the central agency. Ph.D. admissions are also conducted by the Institute through online interview. Although, for the UG there is some delay but academic calendar has been revised in tandem with that, so that the first year may finish by end of June 2021 and the students can join the Institute in August 2021 for III semester as per usual practice. For this, some classes will be conducted on Saturday also via online mode. All Master's and Ph.D. defenses are also being conducted via online mode for timely completion of the program. All efforts have been made for proper delivery of lectures and conduction of exams without any compromise in the quality of education. Q2. How the schools and colleges had been advised to manage their schedule due to the closure of such Instructions during lockdown The classes are being delivered via online mode. The faculty is sharing the course material and videos of their lectures with the students in small modules so that in case some students are not able to attend the class due to internet/ electricity problem, they can refer to the class notes and lectures. The students are also advised to refer the NPTEL and other online materials. Q3 How would the educational institutions cope up with the loss of time on account of closure of Institutions due to COVID 19 The academics were switched to online mode. The academic calendar was revised to compensate the closure due to COVID19. The academic session was extended till end of June in place of first week of May. The vacation period of the students have been used to compensate the loss. Current semester is also started via online mode. Q 4. Has the institute worked out any plan for gradual reopening of educational Institutions countrywide for commencing the new academic year The Institute has already started allowing the research students in the campus to conduct experiments for their research work by following the unlock guidelines. It is planned to open the Institute in phased manner in order of priority. It is also planned that first year students may be allowed to visit the Institute for 10-15 days to complete their experiments in phased manner. If situation becomes normal, the Institute will be fully open till June 2021. Q5. How the Ministry is planning to ensure safety of the students once the Institutions reopen? How practical is to follow social distancing and hygiene norms in a classroom? How would the school transportation operate? Whether the Ministry is preparing any guidelines to monitor the norms to be followed in the Institutions? All protocols and government guidelines related to COVID are being followed. In addition following measures are being taken: -All class rooms, lab, working spaces are being sanitized at regular interval -The strength of the class room is being reduced in order to maintain the social distancing. If need be classes will be held in mixed (online and offline mode) to maintain the social distancing. -At present Institute dos not have any plan to operate transport facility. Out siders coming to the campus are examined using thermal sensor before entry at the main gate. -It is planned to maintain the health record of the students in the hostel. The institute is following all norms as issued by the Ministry. Q 6. What efforts are being made by the Institutions to improve the quality of the learning materials that is used in the teaching and learning process, to re look at their admission practices, admission criteria and the overall recruitment process itself? The online lectures are being recorded and shared in video format to the students. In addition, students are advised to refer to the NPTEL lectures to assure the quality. All efforts have been made to run the session without any compromise in the quality of the education. Q 7. Many students especially rural area students do not have the required infrastructure nor are financially strong to avail the resources required for digital education. What efforts are being made by the Ministry to provide online education to such students and to improvise the digital infrastructure available? Recording of the online classes are being shared with the students. The recordings are being cut in small clippings so that the students having low bandwidth can also download the learning material. Q 8. How will necessary online resources be made available for imparting online education in languages other than English? As the Institute teaching mode is English this situation does not arises. Q 9 Whether any training is being provided to the teachers to use the digital system to provide authentic and proper uninterrupted and seamless education to the students Yes, the faculty has been trained to upload material on the Moodle platform and conduct evaluations on Canvas software.</p>
